

A message from Shri LM Khaute IPS, Director General of Police, Manipur



In the recent past, the Police Department faced two main challenges. One was the Economic Blockade on the two National Highways (NH 37 and NH 2), which started at midnight of 31st October 2016, and the other was the State Assembly Elections 2017, for which polling was done in two phases- on the 4th and 8th of March 2017, with counting of votes on the 11th of March.

During the long economic blockade, under strict monitoring by Hon'ble Manipur High Court, the police and security forces were mandated to bring in every week at least 17 convoys of loaded trucks filled with petroleum products, cooking gas, FCI rice, medicine and other essential commodities. With the help and cooperation of CRPF, BSF, Army and AR, the State Police were able to achieve this target and ensure free flow of essential commodities in spite of ambush by NSCN (IM) on few occasions.

Besides the economic blockade, the UNC had picketed all government offices, which posed a big challenge to preparations and conduct of peaceful and fair elections. Doubts were even raised whether we would be able to conduct Assembly Elections at all. Under strict, day to day monitoring by ECI, security arrangements for training of poll personnel, filing of nominations, campaigning, etc. were done. We gave assurance to the ECI that we were ready to accept the challenges of conducting the elections and we have proved that we could do it.

I am happy to say that in spite of most difficult and trying situations, we were able to conduct one of the most incident free elections in the state. This is possible due to the sincere efforts and hard work put in by all concerned.

I would like to put on record my sincere appreciation to all officers and men of Army, AR, CRPF, BSF and the State Police for the efforts contributed by them for successfully facing the challenges posed by the Economic Blockade and State Assembly Elections 2017. I look forward to continued cooperation and synergy in the months to come.

Raising of Manipur Police Commando (Birth, growth and role)

Terrorist activities in the valley of Manipur began in the year 1978. The first major incident of terrorist activity took place on 29/6/1979 when insurgents shot one Jemadar of 2nd Bn. Manipur Rifles and snatched his 9 mm Pistol at Thangal Bazar in the heart of Imphal. This incident was followed by killing of Police and MR personnel and snatching of arms from them at different places. Following such incidents, the necessity of raising commando unit of Manipur police was felt and for the first time one platoon of 1st Manipur Rifles (MR) was raised as Commando(CDO in short) and they were given special training in the Battalion itself. Another CDO platoon was raised in 1981/1982 at 2nd MR. The two platoons of 1st MR and 2nd MR which were designated as CDO platoons were under the disposal of the SP (Central SP then) for all operational purposes. They were not operationally available to the Commandants. They were stationed at the parent Battalions. Vehicles were earmarked by the SP (Central). However ration, pay, etc were looked after by the Commandant. The CDOs take front line in all the Counter Insurgent (CI) operations and were given special pay.



In April-May, 1984, two cadres of CDO training one for 1st MR and the other for Central Armed Reserve (RL in short) of Manipur Police were conducted at Headquarter 61 Infantry Brigade C/o 99 Army Post Office. For the first time 24 personnel of Police CDO including ASI N. Lokhon Singh and ASI Lalkholam were given CDO training by the instructors of 4th Assam Rifles. In Army they got training in (1) Tactics and Weapons, (2) Unarmed combat/Karate, (3) Ambush, (4) Cordon, search frisking and (5) Firing and weapon handling.

After the training Imphal District Police established/raised a CDO squad consisting of 2 ASI and 22 Constables since June, 1984. A second batch of 25 Civil Police Personnel consisting of 2 ASI and 23 Constables were given CDO training by the Police instructors who were recommended by the Army. The Army conducted test for trainees of the second batch.

As on 29^{th} May, 1984, the strength of CDO, Imphal was 45 including 4 ASIs.

The nomenclature of the so called CDO of Imphal District Police has been changed as the "Rapid Action Police Force (RAPF in short)" since 12th June, 1995. The RAPF was under the command of a Gazette Officer (GO) of Police, specially nominated by the Superintendent of Police/Imphal. The command and supervision on deployment was under the nominated GO. Personnel included in the RAPF were entitled to special allowance and special clothing.

As on 28th June, 1996 the actual strength of CDO/RAPF was 227 including one Addl. SP, two Inspectors, 11 Sub-Inspectors, 1 Jemadar and 5 ASIs.

On 22-03-1998, the nomenclature of police CDO as the RAPF of Imphal West District has been known as "Police CDO" only and was under the direct command of Addl.SP(Rural)/Imphal.


The sanctioned strength of CDO increased from 500 to 800 on 23/9/2003 (vide Govt. order No. 9/3(18)/2003-H dated 23/9/2003.

The sanctioned strength of CDO increased from 800 to 1600 vide Govt. order No. 9/6(2)/06-H(RPC) dated 8/7/2008 including 8GOs, 12 Inspectors/Subedar, 70 SI/Jemadar, 40 ASI, 80 HC/Havildar. Imphal West sanctioned strength at present is with 2 GOs, 4 Inspector, 20 SI/Jem, 10 ASI and 20 HC/Havildar.

Functioning of CDO:

The main responsibility of CDO is CI operations. CDO independently conducts CI operations. They assist civil police in the maintenance of law and order. CDO are also utilized in VVIP duty and national functions such as Independence Day and Republic Day for area domination and giving security to VVIP and public. They are also used for securing Raj-Bhavan, Chief Minister's bungalow and Assembly complex.


Gallantry Medalists announced on 2017 Republic Day

Manipur Police procure Drone



Police Stations inaugurated

Phoubakchao and Keibul Lamjao Police Stations in Bishupur district were inaugurated by the then Hon'ble Chief Minister recently. 




