From the Editor's desk

A grinding halt

Even in normal times normal policing job entails physical and mental stress and hence what a hectic activity it would be when situation assumes criticality can just be fathomed. Manipur Police department were in a relaxed and celebrative mood post this year's Police raising day program on October 19. A planned event such as a musical entertainment nite from talents within the police department during November-December now almost stands scrapped. The major event to have been organized post October 19 last as part of the yearlong celebration of the 125th Manipur police raising day was the Cycle rally from Moirang to Keibul Lamjao on November 16, 2016, aimed to spread awareness about the need to save Sangai, an endangered animal species.



The euphoria associated with the commencement of the year long quascentennial celebration was short-lived. The ongoing indefinite economic blockade which began on 1st November last cut short and dampened the frolic spirit and dumped the department's planned activities at abeyance. Call of duty simply nullified the planned sporting and literary competitions as part of this yearlong celebration. The planned publication of this monthly news bulletin became casualty too. Manipur Police Raising Day 2016 celebrated

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The 124th Raising day anniversary of Manipur Police was held at 1st Battalion, Manipur Rifles parade Ground on 19th October, 2016. Shri O. Ibobi Singh, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Manipur received the salute as Chief Guest of the occasion. Deputy Speaker of Manipur Legislative Assembly Shri Preshow Shimray, Ministers, Parliamentary Secretaries, MLAs, top Civil Officials led by the Chief Secretary, Manipur Shri O. Nabakishore, top Police Officials led by Shri L.M. Khaute, DGP, Manipur, top Army, Paramilitary and CAPF officials and other dignitaries attended the function. Smt. Priyadarshini Laishram, MPS, Addl. Supdt. of Police, MPTC commanded the parade of 22 contingents comprising of Civil Police, IRB, Mahila Battalion, Traffic Police (Women), Home Guards, VDF, NCC, Sainik School, Manipur, Police Dog Squad, Manipur and Manipur Police Sports Club.

Chief Guest of the occasion in his speech said that the law and order in the state has improved over the last few years, *"The police in Manipur take immense responsibility in controlling grave situations involving critical issues. However, they are criticised for the smallest mistakes while trying to maintain law and order. The efforts of Manipur police are praiseworthy,"* he said.

The Chief Minister noted that the state police department is unable to improve its infrastructure for lack of

funds and assured that the government will try to fill the lapses as soon as it gets the required amount of funds. Director General of Police, L.M. Khaute appealed the government to allot land for the construction of residential quarters for policemen.

Over four hundred DGP Commendation Discs were given to different ranks in the police department in acknowledgement of their hard work and sincerity. The Discs were received by the top rung officers of various branches of the department on behalf of the personnel under their respective units.

A multi-coloured Newsletter to be published monthly was launched by the Chief Guest of the function Shri O. Ibobi Singh.

Several awards were instituted on the occasion as an endeavour to encourage the Police to work efficiently and serve the people and the nation. The awards instituted were:

- i) The Best Battalion Award
- ii) The Best Police Station Award and
- iii) The Best Police Officer Award.

3rd IRB, Thoubal, 5th M.R. Tamenglong and 9th IRB, Khuman Lampak were adjudged the Best, 2nd Best and 3rd Best Battalion respectively. While the Best Police Station Award was bagged by Singjamei Police Station, the 2nd Best Police

The best award carries DGP Running Trophy, Commendation Certificate and cash reward of Rs 15,000/-. The 2nd best and 3rd best awards carry Commendation Certificates and cash rewards of Rs 10,000/- and Rs 5,000/- respectively. As an initiative by Manipur Police for extending

Civic Action Programme to the people, the topper of HSLC Exam 2016 conducted by BOSEM namely Ms Suhana Laishram, d/o Dr. L. Birendra of Heirangoithong, Imphal West was also felicitated on the occasion with a cash reward of Rs. 5,000/- and a certificate.

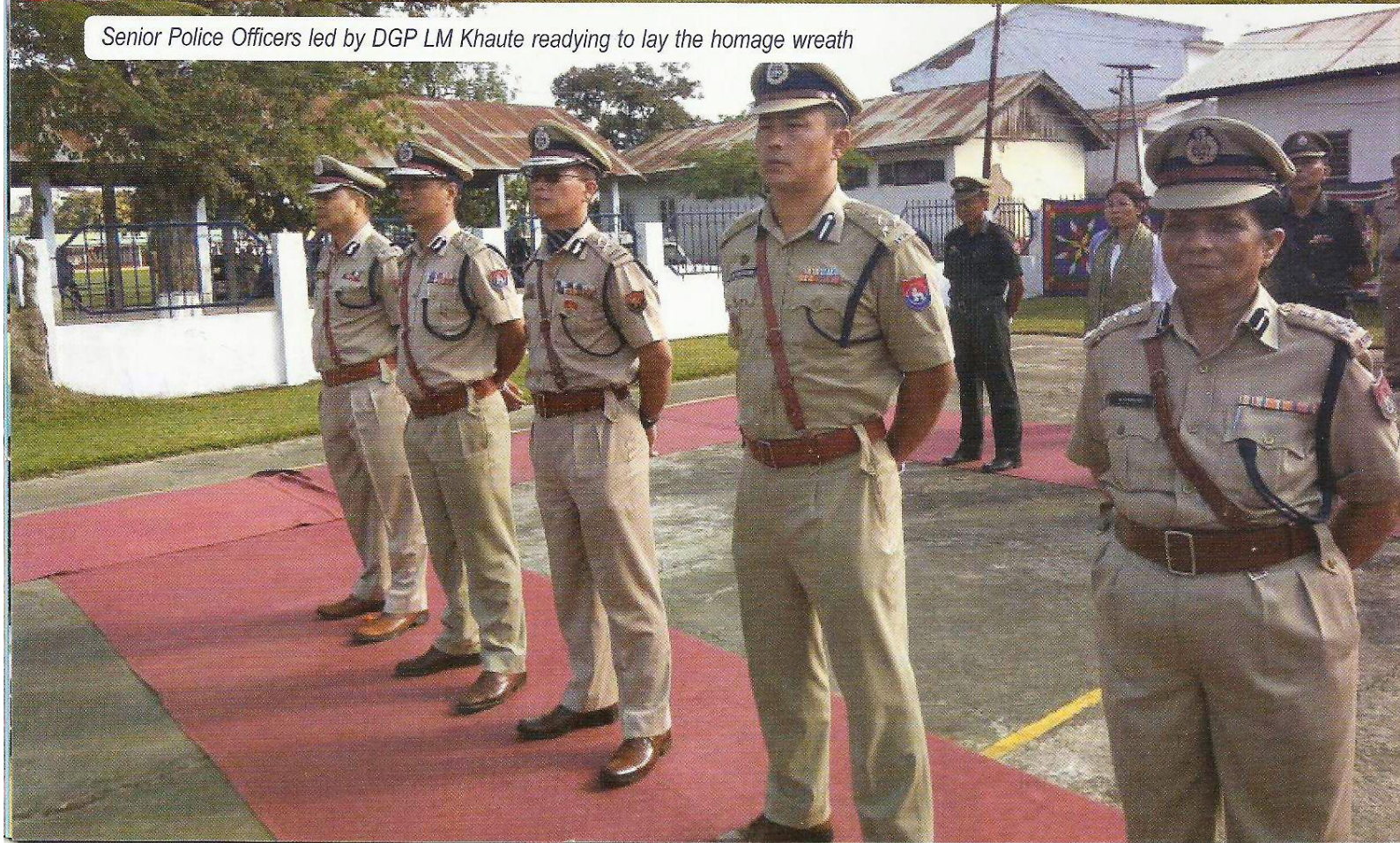


Police Commemoration day 2016 observed

As usual the Manipur Police department observed this year's Police commemoration day too at the Martyrs Park in 1st Manipur Rifles complex, Imphal on 21st October 2016. Shri LM Khaute IPS, DGP Manipur, led the officers in paying tribute by laying wreaths to the fallen policemen during the past one year. A befitting Shokh parade was done on the occasion. Ms Haobam Sangamita, MPS, Dy. SP Prosecution, Ms. Lhingjakim Haokip MPS, Asst. Commt. 9th IRB and Mr. Syed Abdul Samad MPS, Asst. Commt. 4th IRB read out the names of the martyred policemen all over the country during the past one year. A total of 473 (four hundred seventy three) police personnel all over India were killed/met with unnatural death during the period from 1st September 2015 to 31st August 2016.

Subsidiary Police Training Centre inaugurated

The Subsidiary Police Training Centre, Jarolpokpi Jiribam under the MPTC, Pangei was inaugurated by Shri O. Ibobi Singh, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Manipur on 31st October, 2016. The Training Centre was constructed by MPHCL Ltd., Imphal under Plan Schemes for an estimated amount of Rs. 38,89,52,314/- i.e. under Special Plan Assistance (SPA), 13th Finance Commission, and Annual Plan. The STC, Jarolpokpi, Jiribam covering an area of 110 acres with infrastructures and facilities in accordance with the standard requirement of a Police Training Centre, has come up to cater not only to the basic training needs but also for other specialized courses and Refresher Courses, a step

imperative in view of the increased strength of Manipur Police to combat insurgency and volume of crimes. The infrastructure available are 20 nos. of 50 SM Barracks, 2 nos. of 60 SM Barracks, 1 no. of Administrative Building, 1 no. of Quarter Guard, 6 nos. of Kitchen cum Dining Hall, 13 nos. of Toilet Blocks, 5 nos. of Classroom (100 capacity), 10 nos. of quarters (2 nos. of Type IV, 6 nos. of Type III and 2 nos. of Type II), 3 nos. of Unit Store, 1 no. MT Garage for 12 light vehicles, MT Office, POL Store, 2 nos. of structure for followers like Unit Barber/Muchi/Dhobi, Water Supply System, Internal metal/black topped road, compound wall fencing and 2 nos. of Ground Pump (10,000 litres capacity each) and Basic standard obstacles. Construction of 1 no. of wireless office, 1 no. of mini firing range and 1 no. of Type-V quarters are under progress. With the inauguration of the STC, Jarolpokpi, Jiribam, a new chapter has been opened in the Training History of Manipur Police.

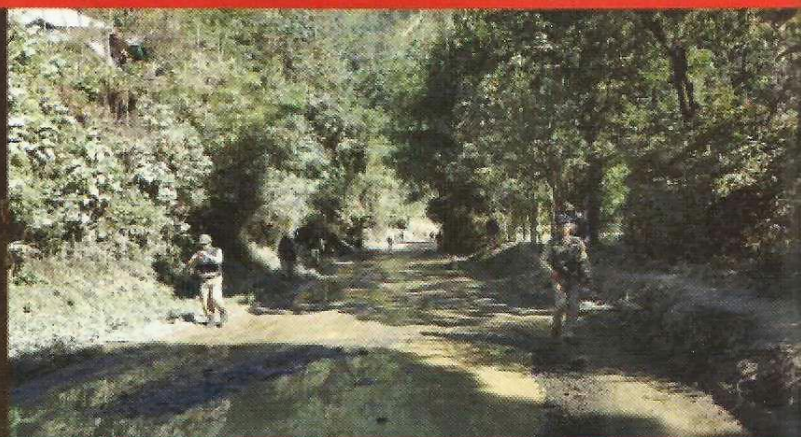
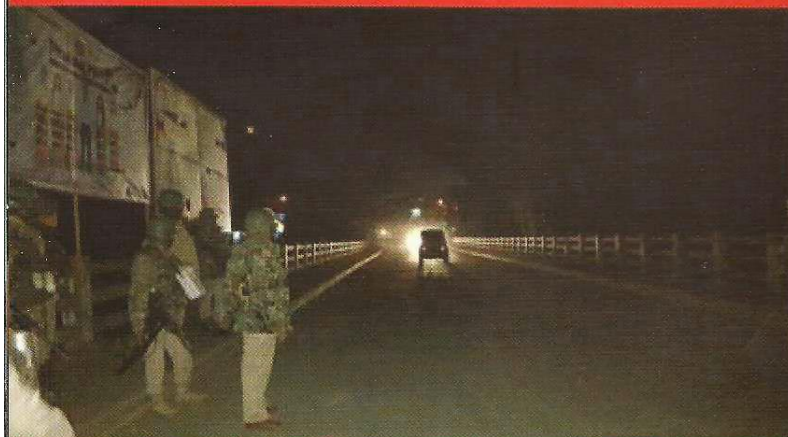

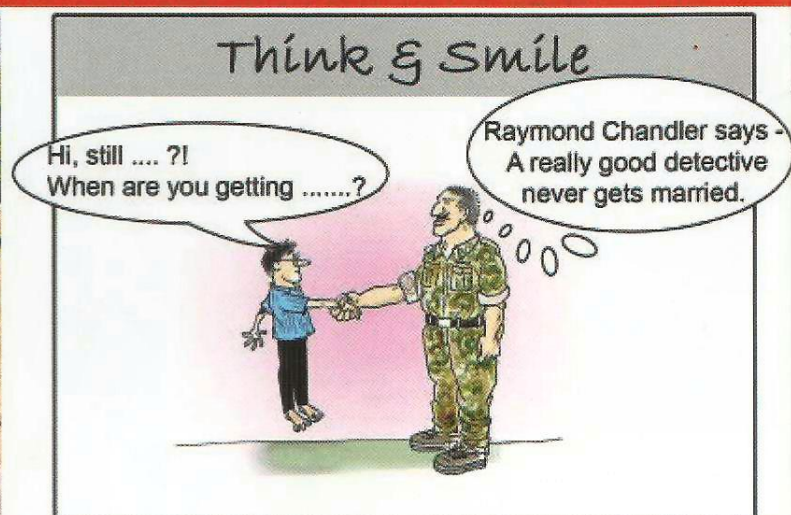
