From the DGP's Desk



Manipur Police will enter 125th year on the 19th October this year, and we plan to observe a year-long celebration to mark the event. The Manipur Police attained centenary on October 19, 1992. The State Police have since undergone transformation in terms of strength, skill, approach, professionalism, equipment, infrastructure, mobility and so on during this chequered history. Today, we are proud to say that our capabilities, achievements and image are on a par with those of the best police force in the country. We have been working under trying circumstances and yet under guidance from the government, we have successfully tackled many difficult situations.

We may briefly recollect our history beginning with the arrival of the British on 27th April 1891 when the State Military Police of Manipur was set up under the command of Assistant Political Agent, Mr. Crawford. The State Military Police then had strength of 1 European Officer, 14 Local Officers, 48 NCOs and 320 Sepoys. At the time of merger of Manipur with India on 15th October 1949, Manipur had only 5 Police Stations and 7 Outposts with a meagre strength of 376 men. In the 1950s-60s, the Manipur Police dealt with unrest and hostilities in the hills, viz. Tamenglong, Senapati, Ukhrul and Churachandpur and exhibited extraordinary bravery. In the valley, the police effectively handled agitations launched by Socialist Party and Communist Party. Many would be surprised to know that a Tear Gas Squad was raised way back in 1959 that was instrumental in effective crowd control.

From the 70s onwards, the Manipur Police faced huge challenges from valley-based insurgent outfits. Many of our men had made the supreme sacrifice. The past five decades would be remembered in the history of Manipur as a turbulent period, during which the State Police contributed immensely towards maintenance of law & order and peace. No other police force in the country would match the commitment, motivation, strategies, courage and tactics adopted by the State Police in the fight against extremists, as is shown by the improvement in law and order today.

Today, we are aware of the challenges and responsibilities that lie ahead. We will continue to strive for higher level of professionalism with renewed commitment through community oriented policing. During the coming year, we will try to bring the Manipur Police closer to the people of Manipur and scale greater heights. On this auspicious day, I wish the officers and men of the Manipur Police success in all their activities.

Police WhatsApp groups:

The use of this social media mechanism has shown encouraging results and also largely promote police-public interface.

It is a well maintained guest house and meant to accommodate mainly serving and retired police officers from other states visiting the state for different purposes including official as well as non-official (personal).

Republic Day and Independence Day successfully celebrated:

As usual the year's (2016) Indian Republic Day and Independence Day were successfully celebrated amidst tight security arrangement owing to boycott and sabotage threat from outlawed armed groups in the state. Manipur Chief Minister Shri O. Ibobi took the salute in both the state level parades for the occasion. Massive turned out was witnessed on both the occasions. CO of 1st Bn Manipur Rifles Shri Th. Radheshyam was the parade commander of the march past of this year's Republic Day Celebration. For the first time, a contingent of women personnel of Nagaland Police took part in this year's Republic Day parade held at Imphal. Apart from this, dog squad of Manipur Police also took part in the parade for the first time. Altogether 97 parade contingents comprising paramilitary, police, school, college, NCC, scout and brand contingents took part in the 66th Republic Day.

Manipur Police officer and boxer MC Mary Kom is now MP:

Very few would be aware that boxer Mary Kom was in the payroll of Manipur police before she landed in the Upper House of the Indian parliament as a member. She was nominated to the Rajya Sabha and took oath as an MP in June 2016. After having become a five time world champion in 49-51 Kg weigh category in international boxing, 'Magnificent' MC Mary Kom was appointed to the Additional SP rank in Manipur police department. She was elevated to SP rank after winning bronze medal for the country in London Olympics in 2012. Considering her immense contribution in the country's sports arena Mary was nominated to the Upper House of the Indian parliament. Salute to the lady pugilist-turned politician.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS OF STATE POLICE DURING PAST FEW MONTHS

HDFC Bank robbery case solved :

A robbery of a kind was enacted at HDFC bank in Thoubal district on July 4, 2016 afternoon by "unknown robbers" armed with knives who overpowered the bank's lone guard armed with a single barrel weapon. A case was registered under FIR 83(7) 2016 TBL PS U/ s 447/392/506/34 IPC in this regard. The robbers looted about 87 lakhs cash and valuables including gold jewelry worth over rupees one crore. The district police swung into action and solved the case. It did not take much time for the police Investigators to find that the robbers connived with some bank staff including the cashier. All those involved in this robbery case were arrested and the looted ornaments to the tune of four Kgs gold were recovered. The case was handled by a SIT consisting of Addl SP (L/O) Rakesh Balwal, IPS, SDPO

Police rescue abducted PRO of MLA

A high profile case of abduction happened in the evening 5th May 2016. Mr. Thangsiabiak @ Biabiak Zou, the PRO of Mr. GS Haupu, MLA from Singat constituency was abducted by an "unknown" UG group who later identified themselves as hitherto unknown Tribal Revolutionary Army and demanded Rs. One crore ransom for his release. On getting specific information the police launched rescue operations in Langol area of Imphal the next day and arrested a person suspected to be involved in the kidnapping. Subsequent interrogation that followed led to the location of the abductors hideout in Sadar Hills bordering Imphal West district. Police commandos lead by Th. Vikram Singh, MPS, Addl. SP (Ops) of Imphal West district conducted further search and rescue operations with the help of satellite phone tracking system to locate the hideout of the abductors and the hostage. The abducted MLA's PRO was released unharmed by late evening of 7th May 2016 consequent upon the pressure mounted by the police.

A spate of abduction for ransom had preceded this high profile abduction. Other abduction cases mostly occurred in far-flung and remote areas but this one had taken place in the heart of the state capital and hence the sensitivity. Moreover, while hapless victims like Truck/Bulldozer drivers are primary and easy targets of abductors in the hills, the victim in this case happened to be a PRO of an MLA. This was one of the successful search and rescue operations conducted by Manipur police in recent months.
